Another year has come and gone in what seems like a blink of an eye. 2021 was a rebuilding year for our YMCA. We were able to start opening up our health and wellness facilities and other programs. It was slow and people were cautious, but little by little our staff team and members returned to the community they know and love at the Y.

Children returned to soccer and basketball and seniors returned for stretching classes and coffee. What we heard repeatedly was how thankful people were to have the Y to return to. The comfort of their community, of friendly faces, and a smile to greet them each day. There were conversations of friends catching up and sharing experiences from being home during pandemic restrictions. Friendships were rebuilt at the Y.

We also found some new members in 2021. People who were longing for connection to their community as well as health and wellness options for their entire family. I love to hear how people first became connected to the YMCA and I love when I get to witness some of those first experiences right here. The sparkle in someone's eyes when they take a group exercise class and impress themselves with their abilities, or the joy of seeing their child learn to swim. Personal goals and successes were rebuilt at the Y.

We also tried to invest in rebuilding some of our programs and facilities. We created more programming options and offered some new experiences like personal training. We collaborated with other organizations to offer programs and worked on creating new partnerships. Some of those collaborations brought us new facilities like the Oroville Convention Center. Fixing roofs, painting walls, and repaving courts were all projects checked off our list last year. We rebuilt facilities and programs at the Y.

At the Y we do so much more than give you a place to work out. We give you a place to be yourself, be with others, and rebuild. It's been quite a year. This year was a rebuilding year for many people and the Y was happy to be part of that and we look forward to building you and ourselves even stronger in the years to come.

OUR AREAS OF IMPACT

Empowering young people to reach their full potential. Improving individual and community well-being. Giving back and inspiring action in our communities.

Our senior population was one of the most impacted during the height of the pandemic. While our YMCA tried our best to make phone calls and provide virtual opportunities, we know that the isolation and lack of resources to therapeutic movement was incredibly challenging for many.

In 2021, when Covid cases started to decrease and restrictions began lifting, we were able to start offering our Aqua Arthritis Management class again. PLAYING WITH PURPOSE Program Highlight: Youth Sports

After almost two years of virtual schooling and canceled extracurricular activities, when it became safe to participate in youth sports again in 2021, our YMCA team worked tirelessly to provide over 1,700 youth a program that would help them develop a lifelong passion for physical activity. Through mask mandates and testing requirements, we ensured that children could gain self-confidence and build positive relationships while learning the value of teamwork and good sportsmanship in our youth sports programs. The volunteer-driven program incorporates over 200 coach mentors who create fun activities and teaching tools that let kids get active and build friendships.

SOCIAL IMPACT OF FOOD PROGRAM **Program Highlight: YMCA Food Program**

The food program at the YMCA focuses on a child's nutrition and health status by providing every child a healthy breakfast, lunch and afternoon snack as they develop and grow.

Healthy and proper nutrition is vital to brain development and healthy growth in all children. It supports muscle growth and boosts immunity. It also keeps a child's skin, teeth, and eyes healthy and helps them maintain a healthy weight.

Volunteers in our community at Bridge Network, La Familia and Boys and Girls Club have worked with the YMCA to ensure that neighborhood youth are getting the nutritious meals that they need to be successful in school and life.
